

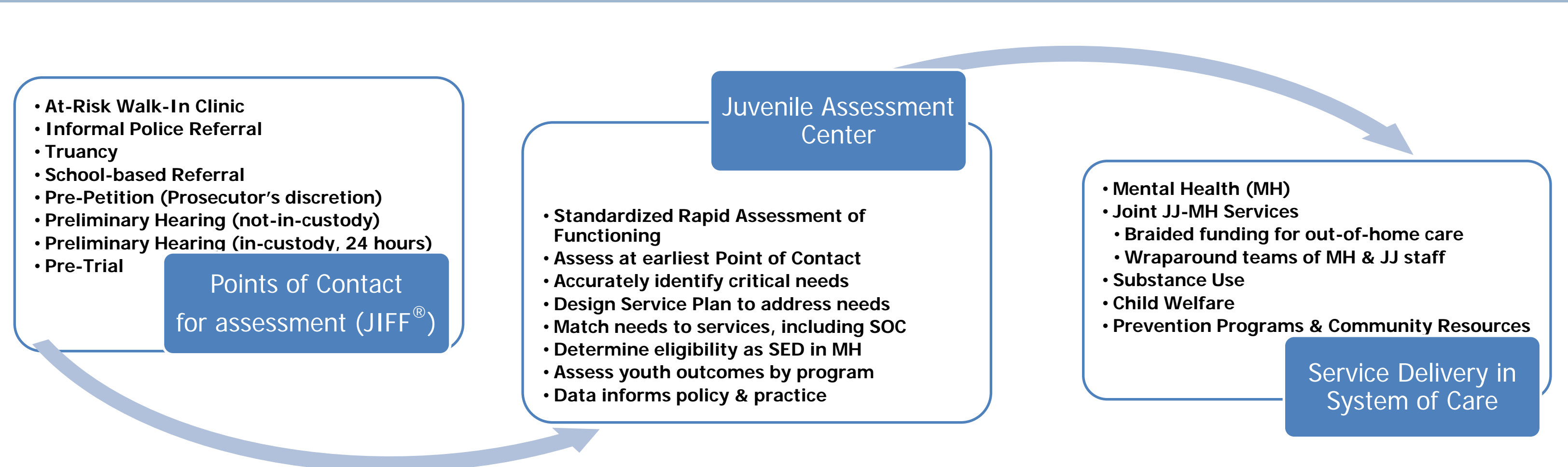
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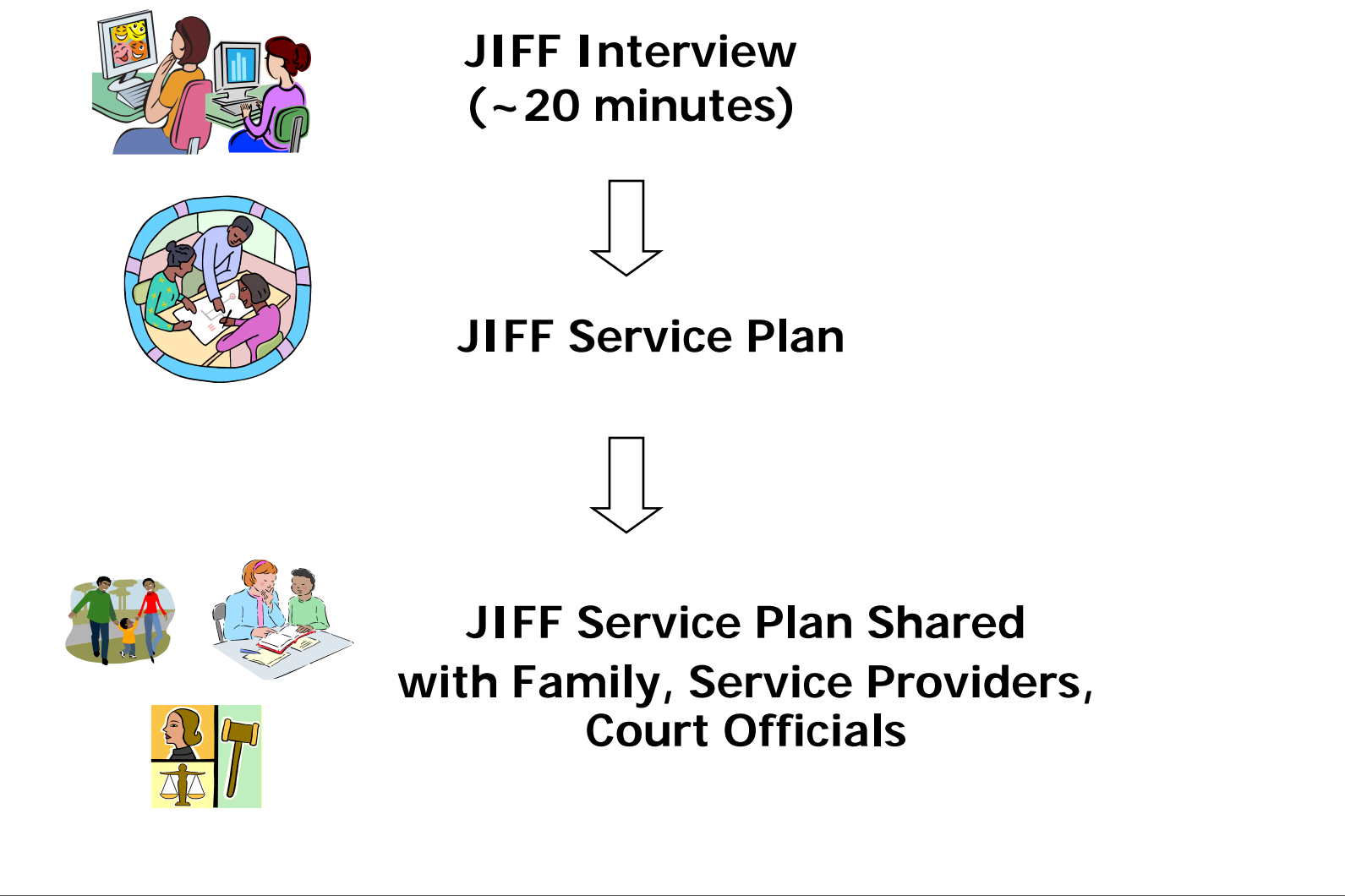

 Transformed assessment and treatment practices ◊ Established formal collaborative relationships with System of Care Partners (SOC) ◊ Increased accountability by monitoring youths' functional outcomes



Goal	Initiative
Reduce entry into Juvenile Justice	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Developed Diversion Program (successful completion = no JJ record) • Expanded opportunities for informally accessing services • Engage parents at earliest point of contact to be part of the solution
Attend to youth's functioning & outcomes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Standardized assessment of functioning (JIFF, CAFAS, etc.) • Service Plan with goals based on the needs of "the whole child" • Direct access to Mental Health and Substance Use Services • Periodic re-assessment to monitor youth progress & track outcomes
Address disparities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Standardized assessments and protocols for all youth • Diversion Program reduces minority penetration

Results of the Correct Course Program : Youth Diverted from Entry into Juvenile Justice & Received Needed Services from System of Care Partners
 Youths (N=308) ◊ Caregivers (N=278) ◊ Mean age= 14 (9-19) 68% Male ◊ 70% African American

Results: Youth Growth, Cost Savings, Low Recidivism

- ❖ Low recidivism rates - 8%
- ❖ Predictors of recidivism - psychosocial impairment (as measured by the JIFF total score) and being male
- ❖ Statistically significant improvement in functioning on JIFF Total score and subscale scores from entry to exit
- ❖ Probation Adjudications reduced – 32.6% less than previous year; 53.1% savings for Probation costs
- ❖ Closed two alternative detention facilities with 58 bed capacity

Significant Changes in Psychosocial Functioning

Paired-T Tests & effect sizes were calculated to compare intake to exit JIFF scores for both the youth and caregiver scores

- ❖ Significant Improvement observed for JIFF Total Score
- ❖ Significant improvement on JIFF subscale scores
- ❖ Large to Moderate effect sizes were observed for the JIFF Total scale, School subscale, and Home subscale

Large Cost Savings

- ❖ Cost of Diversion: \$1500/youth
- ❖ Potential Diversion savings: \$7,500 - \$22,000/youth

Typical Placement Before Correct Course

- ❖ Probation services after adjudication: 6- months services cost \$9,000 /youth
- ❖ Average stay and Detention costs between adjudication and probation: 45 days, \$26,000 /youth
- ❖ Residential care : 6-month cost \$36,000/youth

Low Recidivism

- ❖ Rate of recidivism was very low – 8%
- ❖ Logistic Regression Model found that youth with greater impairment (higher total JIFF score) and males have significantly increased risk of recidivism
 - ❖ Controlled for other sociodemographic characteristics including: age, race, caregiver marital status, offending charges, and initial drug screen.

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
